THE PRESENTERS:

Fr. Bernie Tickerhoof is a friar of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis. He is currently the Director of Novices for his religious community, and serves on his province's leadership team.

Fr. Bernie was ordained in 1978, and has been involved in spiritual ministry and retreat work since 1979. He has traveled widely throughout the country in a ministry of preaching, spiritual conferences, and retreats. He served on the formation team for his religious community as Vocation Director from 1993 to 1996, and has done extensive work in Franciscan Spirituality through the Franciscan Federation of the U.S. and as a spiritual assistant for the Secular Franciscan Order at the local, provincial, and regional levels. Fr. Bernie serves on the Advisory Board of the Institute for Contemporary Franciscan Life at St. Francis University, and teaches a course on Franciscan Servant Leadership for the Institute.

Fr. Bernie is a founding member of the Vineyard Guild, an ecumenical organization dedicated to promoting spiritual leadership and a member of Spiritual Directors International. He is the author of *Conversion and the Enneagram: Transformation Of the Self In Christ* (1991), and Paradox: *The Spiritual Path to Transformation* (2002).

Anne Mulqueen, SFO has served the Order in many ways in the 24 years since her Profession. Currently she is serving as the National Fraternity's International Councilor to CIOFS. Before being elected International Councilor, Anne served as formation director at all levels of fraternity in the United States: local, provincial, regional, and national. In her role as formation director, Anne has conducted and presented at various formation forums, including *Spirit and Life Team* presentations designed to revitalize life in fraternity, *Robert M. Stewart Memorial Seminar*, St. Bonaventure University, New York, Ongoing formation for National Executive Council and National Fraternity gatherings; *Formation on the Road* Workshops, and was one of the lecturers at the first International Formation Workshop in Rome.

Those who attended the 2007 Quinquennial Congress saw Anne "facilitating the facilitators" for the Congress Fraternities, as well as serving on the Quinquennial Planning Committee. Anne has published articles in *The Cord*, a Franciscan Spiritual Review and is the Spirituality writer for the Archdiocese of Baltimore newsletter, *The Voice*.

Anne is Board member for the Institute of Contemporary Franciscan Life, and serves as the Secretary of the Duns Scotus Formation Trust Fund. Anne and her husband Bill have two daughters and live in Kingsville, MD.

Directions to St. Francis University

By Car:

From Northwestern Pennsylvania:

Take I-79 to Rt. 422 east to Ebensburg. In town, turn left at the traffic light onto High Street. Continue straight at next light. Turn left on to Manor Road. Saint Francis University is six miles on the right.

From Cleveland (Ohio area):

Take Ohio Turnpike east to I-80 east. Take I-680 south to Route 422 east (approximately 120 miles) to Ebensburg. In town, turn left at the traffic light onto High Street. Continue straight at next light. Turn left on to Manor Road. Follow this road for six miles to the Saint Francis University entrance on right.

From southwestern Pennsylvania and southeast Ohio:

Take Route 22 east from Pittsburgh to second Ebensburg exit (Ebensburg/Loretto exit). Bear right at end of exit ramp. Proceed straight (crossing over Route 22). Turn right at the first light on to Manor Road. Follow this road for six miles to the Saint Francis University entrance on right.

From Northeastern Pennsylvania/Central New Jersey:

Take I-80 south to I-80 west to exit 161 (Bellefonte). Take US99/Rt. 220 south approximately 50 miles to Altoona and Rt. 22 west. Take Rt. 22 west to Lilly/Portage exit. Turn right onto Rt. 53 north. Continue on Rt. 53 north approximately two miles to traffic light (Sheetz on left). Turn left at light and continue beneath railroad overpass. 200 yards beyond overpass, bear right at Saint Francis University sign onto St. Joseph Street. Take this road four miles to Loretto. At Village Cross monument on traffic circle, bear left. Saint Francis University entrance is 200 yards on left.

From Southeastern Pennsylvania and Baltimore, Maryland/Washington, D.C.:

Take PA Turnpike (I-76) west to Bedford exit 146 (220 North/I-99 North). Turn left after toll booth. At top of hill, turn left onto US99/Rt. 220 north to Altoona. Travel approximately 30 miles to Rt. 22 west. Continue from Altoona -- previous paragraph.
